



Transforming Our Culture

A Report on The 2012 National Pro-Life Conference

Held in Toronto on October 25-27, 2012

Sponsored by Life Canada and Alliance for Life Ontario

Prof. Mark Mostert began Friday morning with a sobering look at “The Ugly Face of the New Eugenics”. **Who are considered ‘useless eaters’? The disabled, anyone who is not seen as a positive ‘contributor’ to society. It is hard to believe there was actually forced sterilization in the U.S. in the 1930’s and 40’s in an attempt to “get rid of feeble-mindedness”. In WWII Germany abortions were *never* allowed for those women deemed “more perfect”. Infants and children considered imperfect were killed in hospital wards and asylums in Germany; unimaginable.**

Dr. Stephen Genuis spoke of the increased risk of breast and cervical cancer, due to the carcinogenic nature of the Birth Control Pill. Pre-term births and low birth weights have escalated, with increased allergies in children; the B.C.P. also impairs the bone development of young women (starting on pill in early teens) causing osteoporosis. Due to the sheer volume of women on the B.C.P., the amount of estrogen which has ended up in the water supply is astronomical. This results in many health problems, including increased prostate cancer (prostate is an estrogen-sensitive gland) and other tumors.

Jenn Giroux, Mom of 9, reminded us that “grandparents are key in cultivating a culture of life (not being ‘done’ with family responsibilities once children are out of the home)”. Unfortunately, the China mentality is already here, with little government persuasion. The birth rate in U.S. is now lower than ever: 63.2 births per 1,000 women in 2011. We must teach our children the beauty of having children, of having siblings!

Prof. Margaret Sommerville told us that there has been a push for pre-natal testing as early as 7 weeks, not always giving the patient accurate information.

Positive stats! 72% of Canadians want a law protecting the unborn. 92% think sex-selective abortion should be illegal. Hopefully Motion 408 will put an end to that practice.

Claire Culwell’s amazing personal story: Her mother had an abortion, which killed her sibling, but then realized that she had been carrying twins and Claire was still there. By some miraculous events, Claire was spared (because a second abortion may have been harmful to her mom, so the doctor refused). Even though there was a lack of support (even from Claire’s grandmother), Claire was born and given up for adoption.

Good news! Some media is starting to listen -- SunNews and the National Post (and the pro-life message is spreading through social media like Facebook).

Stephen Woodworth, M.P., stated that “our fight is not just about abortion - WE NEED LAWS TO PROTECT EVERYONE, and their God-given worth and dignity.”

Reggi Littlejohn ended the conference with a sobering look at the global picture. 400 million abortions in China since the 1970’s (described as a “contribution to the diminishment of global warming” at the Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen -- disgusting). Forced sterilizations without anesthetic are happening all the time. There are about 70,000 children kidnapped and sold on the black market in China every year.
