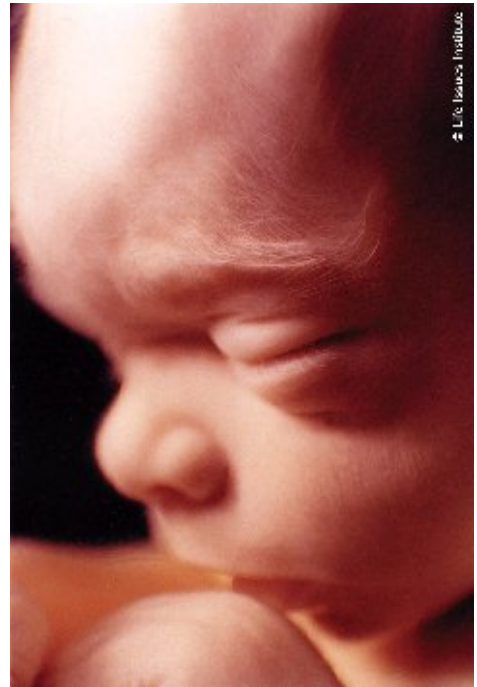
So how is it that Section 223.1 of the Criminal Code defines the child before birth as not a human being?
